PATRONS, PRESIDENT & VICE-PRESIDENTS

PATRONS

Appointment and Terms of Service:

Appointment:

- these are honorary appointments made on the recommendation of the Executive Committee. None of these roles have executive responsibility so do not have voting powers. They are therefore not required to stand for election.

Terms of Service:

- the length of their term of service for their roles is determined by the Executive Committee from time to time and reviewed every 5 years.

Role of Patrons:

- to support and promote The Trust;
- to lend their name to The Trust as a way of supporting and representing our cause;

Patron's Job Description:

- to use their influence and contacts in ways that are beneficial to the aims and objectives of The Trust ;
- to allow the use of their name on The Trust's letterheads and website;
- to accept an Honorary Membership; (please note this category of membership does not have voting powers)
- to be a tactful, critical friend and adviser to The Trust when this is appropriate;
- to attend occasions for supporting and promoting The Trust when they wish and are able to do so;
- the length of service for this appointment to be determined by the Patron in consultation with the Chairman and Executive Committee;

PRESIDENT

Role of President:

- to use their relevant experience and contacts to further the aims and objectives of The Trust;
- to chair the AGM;
- to attend the Executive Committee meetings when they are invited, wish and are able to do so. They can advise when consulted by the Chairman and Executive Committee but without executive responsibility, they have no power to vote;

- if requested, to work with Chairman and the Executive Committee on the future strategic development of The Trust;
- to promote, support and represent The Trust at appropriate functions and celebrations;
- the length of service for this honorary appointment to be determined by the Executive Committee from time to time and reviewed every 5 years;

VICE-PRESIDENT

Role of Vice-President:

- Vice Presidents are appointed for the valuable service they have rendered The Trust and if they wish may continue to do so in an honorary capacity;
- to promote The Trust at relevant functions and celebrations;
- in the absence of the President, one of the Vice-Presidents is nominated by the Executive Committee to preside over the AGM;
- to attend the Executive Committee meetings when they wish to do so, or are invited by the Executive Committee to advise on their particular area of expertise but without executive responsibility, they have no power to vote;
- when consulted by the Executive Committee, to advise on recommendations for the strategic development of The Trust;
- the length of service for this honorary appointment to be determined by the Executive Committee from time to time and reviewed every 5 years;
